





Clyde Stubblefield worked with James Brown from 1965-1971. His playing on the Album Cold Sweat established the rhythmic template for funk and is rightly regarded as being pivotal in the history of popular music. But it was his work on Brown's Song Funky Drummer that would echo through the ages. A 20-second drum loop that would go on to be sampled on over 1300 songs, from Public Enemy and Beastie Boys to George Michael, Britney Spears and Ed Sheeran. 




Play the hihat on the surface only (with the tip of the stick).



# Soloing & Dueling Like Gregory Set Up



In 1969, the band "The Winstons" recorded the single "Color Him Father". For the B-side they recorded the instrumental "Amen, Brother" based on the gospel song "Amen". At about 1 minute and 26 seconds into "Amen, Brother", the drummer Gregory C. Coleman performs a four-bar drum break that lasts for seven seconds. Years later this drum break has been used in thousands of tracks of various genres, making it one of the most sampled recordings in music history.







Despite the thousands of hit records on which Bernard Purdie has performed, he has never seemed to get his die recognition. He recorded over 4000 albums and a lot of them turned into multi-million dollar paydays for countless bands and artists. He is known for his precise musical time-keeping and his signature beat called the "Purdie Shuffle". Bernard Purdie worked together with artists like Aretha Franklin, James Brown and many more.

Please pay attention to the exact execution of all rim shots and ghostnotes (play them lightly)! The cymbals also should be played with a light touch.




The left foot lightly bounces on the pedal (heel up) without opening the hihat. If this is to hard to execute, play the beat without doing this.
